regard for him. The cup is inscribed with the names of all the donors and this testimonial: "To Walter G. Bushong, Chief of Police, Lancaster, Pa., 1904-1921. A token of esteem and respect from his associates, the police of Lancaster, Pa."

Alderman Doebler, in making the presentation, paid a high tribute to Chief Bushong as official and citizen, a speech that was roundly applauded. It was decided that the committee of arrangements, accompanied by as many of the other members of the old force as could be on hand, should gather this evening at 7 o'clock at Duke and East King streets, and then call at the former chief's home, and hand the cup to him without formalities.

The address of Alderman Doebler was followed by short speeches by half a dozen others present, including Former Mayor Kennedy and City Controller Keefer, who paid high tribute to the Chief. The entertainment closed at a seasonable hour, and with the departure of the banqueters, Red Rose Lodge, No. 16, Fraternal Order of Police, under the auspices of which the entertainment was given, went out of existence.
