"Unfortunately, in at least two instances in the county, one township and one borough, this was not the case. These two governments did not see fit to negotiate their police as required in the act," Schreder said.

He said the situation amounts to one in which police are expected to obey the law, but persons they are dealing with are not expected to observe the law.

"The past several weeks I read in the newspapers where the Borough Association is collecting funds to fight this act. I say this is wrong. The voters gave us this right. Now the politicians are spending the taxpayers money to fight some thing they are in favor of.
