

City Police Ask Collective Bargaining

Want to Start Discussing Pay For New Budget

City officials have received notice that it's time to start thinking about preparation of the 1969 budget—and how to keep costs down or find new sources of revenue.

The notice came Tuesday in the form of a registered letter from the Red Rose Lodge, Fraternal Order of Police, to individual city councilmen and officials.

SALARY, BENEFITS

The letter was an official notification that the police want to hold collective bargaining on salary and fringe benefit increases next year.

In the past, policemen and firemen have complained that city officials don't bargain with them, but merely decide arbitrarily how much pay increase they will receive. But recent state legislation gives them the right to choose collective bargaining agents and for binding arbitration.
